

Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department MONTHLY REPORT • FEBRUARY 2018

The men and women of the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department are committed to protecting life, property and the environment of our great city by providing fire suppression, fire prevention, emergency medical and all-hazards emergency preparedness services to Duval County's 840 square miles of metropolitan, suburban, rural and oceanfront communities.

Our firefighters operate out of 58 fire stations with a fleet of apparatus that include 48 rescues, 54 fire engines/squads, 13 ladder trucks and three fire boats; all of which are Advanced Life Support (ALS) staffed and equipped. We also operate a fleet of water tankers and other apparatus with specialized capabilities, such as aircraft firefighting, technical rescue and hazardous materials response.

NOTE: The JFRD billed account values are the number of new patient accounts (charges) that were created within the month searched, for treatment and transportation services rendered. JFRD Rescue personnel do not routinely attain insurance status from patients. Insurance information is attained by billing personnel after the transport and the report are complete. Transportation and destination decisions are based on uniform guidelines and free from the influence of ability to pay, social status, convenience of attendants or other discriminatory factors. Patients will be transported based on patient assessment to the most appropriate hospital, consistent with their condition. Patients who are unstable will be transported to the closest most appropriate hospital.
