

The Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department provides fire suppression, fire prevention, emergency medical and all-hazards emergency preparedness services to Duval County's 840 square mile metropolitan, suburban, rural and oceanfront communities.

Our emergency response fleet of apparatus and firefighters operate out of 58 fire stations and includes 43 rescues, 55 fire engines, 12 ladder trucks, three squads and three fire boats; all of which are Advanced Life Support (ALS) licensed and staffed with Firefighter/Paramedics.

JFRD Rescue personnel do not routinely attain insurance status from patients. Insurance information is attained by billing personnel after the transport and the report are complete. Transportation and destination decisions are based on uniform guidelines and free from the influence of ability to pay, social status, convenience of attendants or other discriminatory factors. Patients will be transported based on patient assessment to the most appropriate hospital.

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
